

Stewards & Judges Advisory Committee

- Encourage racing commissions to establish an annual performance evaluation for stewards & judges
- Recommended "Points of Emphasis" for 2007
 - Uniform posting of inquiry sign
 - Requiring jockey to ride horses out to the wire best effort
 - Uniform reviewing of race video before posting official
 - Routine communications with all stakeholders to include owners, trainers, jockeys, track management, fans and other racing officials

Format:

- Presentations by leading veterinarians, surgeons, equine scientists and racing surface engineer
- Panel discussions with breeders, trainers, jockeys, bloodstock agents and track management
- Strategic planning sessions with six working groups
- Reviewed critical issues relating to fewer starts
- Developed recommended action plans and timelines

Results:

- Develop statistics on the durability of blood-lines and matings
- Distribute scientific research to industry stakeholders
- Examine the use or ban of certain horseshoes
- Develop a uniform on-track injury reporting system

Results:

- Require uniform certification and examination for first-time trainers, jockeys, exercise riders, farriers and racing officials
- Provide and require continuing education for license renewal of all trainers, jockeys, exercise riders, farriers and racing officials
- Develop a standardized method and reporting system for testing all racing surfaces at all tracks
