POLITICAL NEEDS

- Lobbying, public affairs and public relations
- Political Action Committee

A well-versed, respected legislative champion

- Identify all direct and indirect beneficiaries
- Make the industry jargon easily understood

STRATEGIC NEEDS

- Identify the real players inside and outside the issue
- Create trustful, lasting alliances within the industry
- Signed memorandum of understanding among players
- Designate a single spokesperson
- Meet, befriend and familiarize key legislative staffers
- Constantly monitor the process and its status

ALONG THE WAY

- Patience is a necessary virtue
- Speed of working government is slow
- Check and re-check all legislative language
- Beware of lobbyists representing multiple clients
