

TRIAGE SCORING:

- No Lameness detected
- Grade III or lower lameness; no obvious limb deformity
 >Grade III lameness; no obvious limb deformity
- Mild to moderate limb instability in 1 plane; closed injury
- Severe instability in 1 plane; closed injury
- Limb instability in 2 or more planes / loss of column of support (open or closed); open: fx/joint capsule/tendon sheath
