## Slot Machines in Florida

- Broward County licensed slot facilities:
- Gulfstream Park Racing Association- 516 slot machines
- Mardi Gras Racetrack and Gaming Center- 1,230 Machines
- The Isle Casino and Racing at Pompano Park - 1,500 Machines
- Diana Jai-Alai - Not yet operating
- Miami-Dade facilities:
- Calder Race Course
- Flagler Greyhound
- Miami Jai-Alai

## Division Regulatory Structure

- The Division of Pari-Mutuel Wagering is a program area within the Florida Department of Business and Professional Regulation
- The division has 100 fulltime positions
- 62 positions used for the regulation of pari-mutuel wagering
- 38 positions used for the regulation of slot operations
- The division's FY 06/07 operating budget was: \$18.2 Million
- $\$ 10.5$ Million for the regulation of pari-mutuel wagering
- \$7.7 Million for the regulation of slot operations
- The Florida Department of Law Enforcement is statutorily required to partner with the division to aid in the regulation of slot operations.
- \$3.2 Million budget


## Regulatory Oversight

- Florida statutes authorize pari-mutuel wagering for thoroughbred racing, harness racing, greyhound racing, jai-alai; and cardrooms and slot machines at eligible facilities.
- The division regulates:
- 31 Licensed permitholders operating at 26 facilities
- 18 Greyhound permitholders
- 8 Jai-alai permitholders
- 4 Thoroughbred permitholders
- 1 Harness permitholder
- 18 Cardrooms operating at pari-mutuel facilities
- 3 Slot facilities located in Broward County's pari-mutuel facilities
- Occupational licenses:
- As of June 30, 2007 the division has issued over
- 17,700 pari-mutuel occupational licenses
- 2,700 slot occupational licenses
- 1,300 cardroom occupational licenses

## Regulatory Requirements

## During Fiscal Year 2006/2007

- 1,500 Class III slot machines per facility
- \$3 million dollar annual license fee per facility
- \$250,000 compulsive addictive gambling prevention program fee per facility
- 50\% flat tax rate on net slot machine revenue
- Taxes from slot machine revenue go to the Educational Enhancement Trust Fund


## During Fiscal Year 2006/2007

- Progressive jackpots and games prohibited
- Automated teller machines (ATM's) prohibited from the facility
- Check cashing prohibited
- Authorized to operate 16 hours a day
- Slot machines are required to be tested by a state licensed independent testing laboratory


## During Fiscal Year 2006/2007

- Required minimum payout is 85\%
- Actual payout is approximately 91\%
- Each facility is required to have their own facilitybased monitoring system
- The division and Florida Department of Law Enforcement are required by law to have fulltime access to the facility-based monitoring system
- Machines can accept tickets and cash, but must only cash out in tickets


# Regulatory Changes for Fiscal Year 2007/2008 

- 2,000 Class III machines per facility
- Progressive jackpots permitted within the facility
- "Non-redeemable credits" can be deducted from slot machine revenue
- Promotional play credits that cannot be redeemed for cash or anything of value


## Regulatory Changes for Fiscal Year 2007/2008

- Automated teller machines (ATM's) permitted within the facility, but prohibited within the slot gaming area
- Check cashing permitted for patrons and employees
- Hours of operations allowed:
- 18 hours a day Monday through Friday
- 24 hours a day Saturday and Sunday and specified state holidays

## Competition

- 7 Indian casinos
- Currently unregulated by the state, compact pending
- "Cruises to nowhere"
- Unregulated by the state
- "Adult arcades"
- Unregulated by the state
- Florida Lottery
- Regulated by the Department of Lottery


## Pending Indian Compact

- 25-year compact that gives the Seminole Tribe the right to operate the following:
- Class III slot machines
- Banked card games
- Black jack, baccarat, and chemin de fer
- Six no-limit poker tournaments each year, with 70\% of the revenues going to charitable organizations
- The state will only provide oversight
- The state agency responsible for the oversight is to be determined by the Legislature
- Guarantees an annual minimum payment to the state of:
- \$100 million in the first year;
- \$125 million the second year; and
- No less than $\$ 150$ million in the third year.

## Cardrooms

# Regulatory Requirements During FY 2006/2007 

- Non-banking games of poker can be played at the 18 cardrooms located throughout the state
- $10 \%$ tax is paid on cardroom gross receipts
- Cardrooms were required to operate on a day there was a live pari-mutuel event
- Maximum wager is $\$ 2.00$ with a maximum of 3 raises in any round of betting
- Cardroom gross receipts have increased approximately 10 fold from 97/98 to 06/07


## Regulatory Changes for FY 2007/2008

- Authorized cardroom games:
- Non-banking games of poker
- Dominoes
- Maximum wager $\$ 5.00$ with a maximum of 3 raises in any round of betting
- Cardrooms are authorized to operate year-round
- Games of Texas Hold-em without a betting limit if the required by-in is no more than $\$ 100$ are authorized
- Poker tournaments are authorized
- October 2006 vs. October 2007
- Cardroom gross receipts increased 87\%
